

Foreword

his book is a wakeup call. It is a must read for non-Muslim Americans. Zionist fingerprints are all over the post-September 11 world but they seem invisible to most US citizens. Our major leaders and other opinion-makers are engaged in what is little short of a conspiracy to keep Israel's broad, destructive involvement in America's national interests off the public's radar screen.

Ahmed Yousef uses plain language. He recognizes that this is no time for tiptoeing around sensitive topics, for mincing of words. The US-spawned international calamity of which the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq may prove to be only the opening

salvos is rooted in the control that Israel and its American supporters are able to exert on US policy, foreign and domestic. Today's calamity is no small skirmish that can soon be forgotten. The stakes are enormous.

"America rules the world, and Israel rules America." This is not hyperbole from a bomb-throwing extremist. It is the recent assessment of Uri Avnery, a respected Israeli commentator, peace advocate, and former Knesset member. America's worldwide rule may be questioned, but the rule that Israel exercises over America is beyond challenge. It is a fact that the vast majority of the American people do not yet comprehend. Most are oblivious to the degree to which people whose primary allegiance is to Israel have penetrated our political and governmental system, the media, academia, and even business leadership. And, of course, these uninformed citizens cannot possibly be aware of the catastrophic damage to our national interests for which pro-Israel zealots are responsible.

In the speeches in which President George W. Bush tried to justify pre-emptive war against Iraq, he never mentioned Israel, the only country in which both state and population strongly supported the war. It is possible that Bush really believed at the pre-war stage that Iraq posed a threat to the United States via weapons of mass destruction and Al-Qa'eda, but observers able to penetrate the Washington miasma knew early on that the warnings were a hoax and that the war was really undertaken mainly to improve Israel's comfort level. If Israel did not exist, no one in authority would have seriously considered a military assault on Iraq. The Zionists in the Defense Department who organized the war against Iraq planned it as early as 1992, years before September 11.

The wars against Afghanistan and Iraq have done nothing to redress grievances that may have prompted September 11, nor is there evidence that these undertakings have weakened Al-Qa'eda as an instrument of violence and destruction. The US investment in lives and other resources in these military operations is already

massive. "Postwar" American deaths in Iraq now outnumber those before Bush proclaimed "mission accomplished."

The president's request for \$87 billion to cover operations in Iraq and Afghanistan for the coming year suggests the enormity of the eventual price tag.

In this outlay, I discover not even one dollar to examine the grievances that may have provoked September 11. The dreadful assault on America that day was a criminal act by a non-governmental entity, and the response should have been police action, seeking the arrest and punishment of individual criminals, not the destruction of governments and the death and devastation of innocent people. When police hunt for perpetrators of crime, it is normal to quickly seek motivations in order to identify grievances that may have inspired unlawful action. In the wake of September 11, our government did nothing, so far as I can determine, to find out why these criminals behaved as they did. In several tapes broadcast on television, Osama bin Laden consistently listed US complicity in Israel's brutal treatment of Palestinians as one of the main grievances.

President Bush says the perpetrators of terrorism hate our freedom and our prosperity. There is no basis for this assertion. Yousef writes: "[Arabs and Muslims] actually value and respect these internal American attributes. What they hate is America's behavior beyond its own borders."

September 11 should have motivated the US government to remove the bias in its Middle East policies, instead of launching costly and floundering wars against two Muslim countries.

While grim, the situation is not hopeless. I have absolute confidence in the capacity of American citizens to overcome any challenges that arise, including this one. Once aware of the destructive effect of our longstanding, ever-deepening, and uncritical bias for Israel and against the Arab-Muslim world, the American people will force constructive policy change from the White House level on down.

If this remarkable book reaches a large audience in America—as it should—it will help bestir our fellow citizens to corrective action. With exacting precision Dr. Yousef identifies the Zionist footprints that have appeared on the world scene since September 11, footprints that mean painful burdens for all Americans. He warns of the dangerous implications of an anti-terrorism campaign gone wild, especially as it restricts the civil liberties of people on the sole basis of national origin and leads to even more destructive foreign policy bias. He also reviews the techniques used by Israel's US lobby to dominate the legislative process and intimidate officials in the executive branch.

One of the great tragedies of the Zionist movement is the legacy of hate and bigotry it has spawned on both sides of the Arab-Israeli conflict. Suicide bombers have deepened the Israeli revulsion and fear of Palestinians, and almost all Palestinians know Jews only as pilots of helicopter gunships and tanks who inflict death, destroy homes and olive groves, and enforce endless misery.

Readers will find Dr. Yousef's litany astounding and troubling, but I believe his text will prompt an awakening to a truth that all Americans should accept: all people are equally deserving of justice and dignity, irrespective of race, religion, and nationality.
